UV and Me Launch

Yesterday, our 'UV and Me' program was launched. The day commenced with a whole school assembly. Former student Barry Jones attended the launch and presented the keynote address. Barry is a former teacher, lawyer, politician, writer and broadcaster and it was a pleasure to hear him speak. Also in attendance was Justine Osborne, School and Early Childhood coordinator at Sunsmart. Our beautiful UV flag, designed by Sarah Kasner LA15, was run up the flagpole. The flag will be flying on days when the UV is high and will be a warning to our students to put on their hats and sunglasses.

The students then rotated through a series of sunsmart activities organised by the UV and Me committee, Melanie Sput, Rachele Meuse, Katherine Gauci and David Oxworth or, as I call them, the 'Young Guns'. Students were encouraged to wear red, orange, purple and yellow, the UV colors.

Dan Levin's contribution to this project, which has excited the interest of the Department of Science and the Environment and Sunsmart, needs to be acknowledged. Dan's Caulfield South weather station provides constant updates of UV data on our website. Dan also organised sponsorship from Bicycle Superstore in Mentone for the school. For those students who ride bikes, the need to cover up and protect, i.e. by wearing sunscreen, is significant.

I wish to thank the "UV and Me committee and Dan for their great contribution to this exciting project. I would also like to point out that some of the leading designs for the flag (including the winning design) are on display in the main building near the door out to the quadrangle and are really worth a look.
